The infographic details how the minimum wage hikes this year alone will cost 383,000 jobs. The number of jobs lost will increase to 2.6 million when the entire minimum wage increases are fully phased-in.

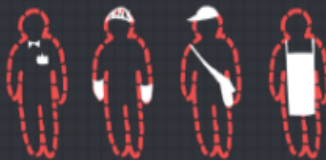
