*Gig is defined as independent contractors, consultants, temp agency workers, on-call workers, freelancers and contract company workers**

In **2014**, gig economy workers represented:

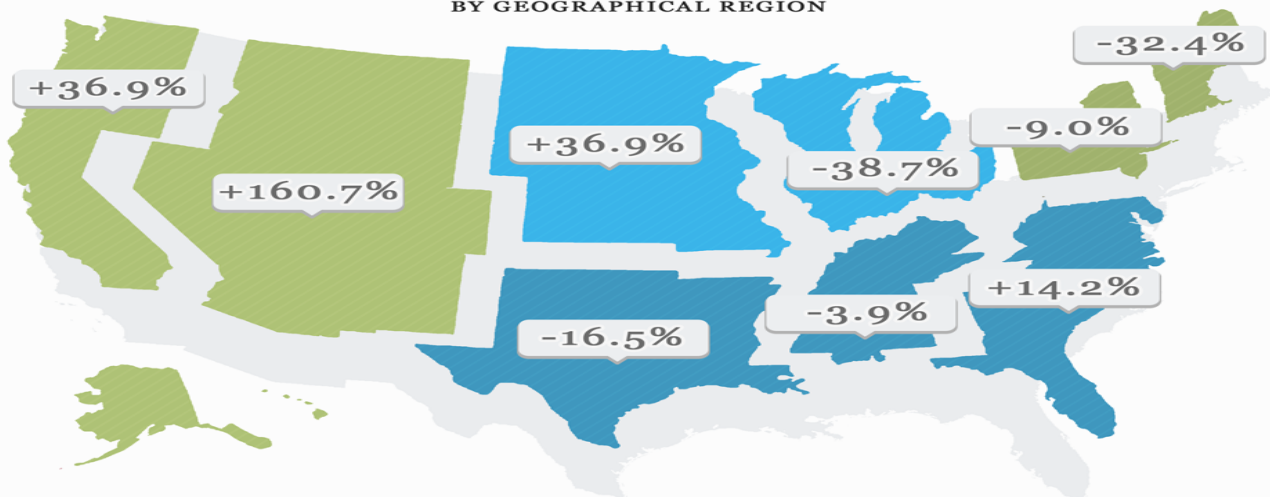
