The Obama administration has issued more than \$80 billion in new and proposed regulatory burdens. The White House even concedes that there are more than 8.8 billion hours of cumulative regulatory compliance. With hundreds of major rules issued each year, Congress has little oversight authority to rescind onerous regulations. The REINS Act (Regulations from the Executive In Need of Scrutiny) would require that all new major rules receive approval from Congress and the President before implementation.
