## New Podcast Episode: Extending the TCJA & Expanding the Child Tax Credit

In this episode of the AAF Exchange, AAF's Vice President for Economic Policy Gordon Gray and special guest Machalagh Carr – an outside AAF fiscal policy expert – discuss Congress' consideration of extending components of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) and expanding the child tax credit.

- In "Reassessing the Budgetary Treatment of Refundable Tax Credits," Gray walks through the evolution of refundable tax credits' budgetary treatment, recent policy changes, and the trade-offs that must be considered in the design of these tax credits.
- In "Growth, the Budget, and the TCJA," Holtz-Eakin explains the debate surrounding the TCJA's future, with competing interests of promoting economic growth and fiscal responsibility.
- In "The Budgetary Issues Framing 2024," Holtz-Eakin discusses the major issues contributing to the worsening budgetary crisis.
- In "Highlights of CBO's Update to the Budget and Economic Outlook for 2024–2034," Gray reviews CBO's recently released updated budget and economic outlook, which provides Congress with a 10-year budget and economic baseline to assess the cost of legislation.
- In "The Economic and Budgetary Effects of Immigration Reform: S. 744 Revisited," Holtz-Eakin translates CBO's 2013 projected impacts of S. 744 into projected impacts over the 2024–2033 budget window.
