



ENDING THE SOCIAL COST OF CARBON MEASURE

President Trump has signed a new executive action on the "Social Cost of Carbon" (SCC), a measure that quantifies the benefit of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

WHAT DOES ENDING THE SCC MEAN FOR REGULATION IN THE FUTURE?

The SCC generated

\$6.3 BILLION

in regulatory benefits

However, it yields only

14%

of all stated benefits

AAF identified

55 RULES

that quantified a reduction
in carbon emissions

Out of the 55 rules,

7 RULES

would not have net benefits if
SCC were excluded



And out of those rules

4 RULES

would have annual benefits
under \$100 million

Removing the SCC will make a difference, but it will not upend all energy and environmental rules nor tip the scales.
